BRIEF INTERVENTIONS FOR DRINK DRIVER OFFENDERS IN SLOVENIA

SITUATION IN SLOVENIA

- Aprox. 150 victim in road accidents per year (2 millions inhabitants)
- x > 1/3 of them related to drink driving

LEGISLATION * Law on Road Safety 2008: If BAC >1,5g alcohol/kg blood \rightarrow

arrest at police station for 6 – 12 hours + penalty (driving licence retained for 24 hours + fine + penalty points)

× *<u>Result</u>*: still 10 - 40 drink drivers arrested/night

- x Law on Road Safety December 2010 (July 2011):
- × If BAC >1,1g alcohol/kg blood \rightarrow

arrest at police station for 6 – 12 hours + ↑ penalty (driving licence retained at court until positive medical opinion + ↑ fine (1.200 EUR) + ↑ penalty points (18=max)) * Result: ?

LEGISLATION

× Law on Road Safety December 2010:

x If BAC 0,8 – 1,1g alcohol/kg blood (0,38 – 0,52 mg alcohol/L breath) →

penalty (driving licence retained for 24 hours + 900 EUR + 16 penalty points) **BUT at the same time:**

 A penalty points are deleted if the driver visits authorized medical center (traffic medicine specialist, addiction medicine specialist and psychologist) and attend a special course (6 – 17 hours), organized for drink drivers

LEGISLATION

× Law on Road Safety December 2010:

★ If BAC 0,5 - 0,8g alcohol/kg blood (0,24 - 0,38 mg alcohol/L breath) →

penalty (driving licence retained for 24 hours + 600 EUR + 8 penalty points) BUT at the same time:

 * 4 penalty points are deleted if the driver visits his GP/FP for brief intervention ("medical examination with counselling")
 * only once in 3 years

TRAINING

- in spring 2011 organized 45 short courses (3 hours) for all PHC physicians with patients' lists
 - courses financed by the Ministry of Health
- × 1150 PHC physicians (invited by post and e-mail):
 - + 300 already trained in last 5 years
 - + 650 attended course (76%) for basic principles of screening and brief intervention + printed material
 - + 200 received printed material (*manual for GP/FPs for SBI, *AUDIT questionnaire, *practical answers related to novelties in Law on Road Safety)

TRAINING

- × 45 courses in 33 cities in health centers
 × Content:
 - 1. how SBI is incorporated in 6 GP/FP's competences according to EURACT teaching agenda and GP/FP's paradigm of health promotion, prevention, teatment and rehabilitation
 - 2. novelties in Law of Road Safety important for GP
 - 3. low risk, hazardous and harmful drinking, alcohol addiction
 - 4. harmful concequences of alcohol drinking
 - 5. screening (AUDIT) and brief intervention
 - 6. specific SBI for drink drivers (medical examination with conselling)

MEDICAL EXAMINATION WITH COUNSELLING

- AUDIT and disccussion on drinking habits (clinical examination if needed)
- x assessment of driver's drinking
- assessment of driver's awareness of his hazardous or harmful drinking or addiction
- information exchange on alcohol harmful effects with emphasis on driving
- behaviour change counselling according to stage of change, importance and confidence OR referal to authorized medical center if addiction

FACILITATORS

- × Law on Road safety prepared in collaboration of 4 ministries: of health, of traffic, of interior an of justice (→ no opposition in government)
- support of the Ministry of health
- willingness of 7 colleagues GPs/FPs to study and learn training programme on SBI and to run courses
- × support of the Department of family medicine

BARRIERS

- * scepticism among physicians about the effectiveness of such brief interventions
- scepticism among some specialists for traffic medicine and clinicians that GPs/FPs will be competent for this task
- being already much overloaded with everyday work there was opposition among some GPs/FPs because of new task

WAY FORWARD

- × monitor the performance of BI
- x analyze the long-term results of BI
- x update knowledge and skills for SBI among physicians
- × educate more nurses to do SBI
